



Dr. Emily Gordon started local chapter **WIA-UPenn** due to a paucity of senior women in their department and the need to develop greater mentorship. They organized several activities including a meet and greet, a panel discussion on work-life integration, a negotiation workshop, a session with faculty affairs on academic promotion, and a session on time management. It took 6-8 hours of time to plan each event, but the benefit was increasing communication and awareness amongst male and female members in the department, including residents and faculty. She received help from **Dr. Meghan Lane-Fall** and **Dr. Elizabeth Valentine**, and her efforts have spread to Children's Hospital of Philadelphia to include **Dr. Stephanie Black**. Attendance at various events, some which included men and some which were exclusive to women, have varied from 10-60 people. Future goals include involving more medical campuses in the Philadelphia area and bringing in outside speakers into the department. As far as advice for other chapters, Dr. Gordon suggests engaging leadership teams, maintaining confidentiality during discussions so people can speak freely, and organizing a variety of events to reach as many people as possible!

WIA-Indiana hosted its second statewide Women in Anesthesiology conference through the Indiana Society of Anesthesiologists. Current WIA president **Dr. Amy Pearson** spoke on "Millennials in Medicine" alongside **Dr. Talia Ben-Jacob** who encouraged the group on mentorship. **Dr. Laura Dew** discussed challenges in private practice and leadership, and **Dr. Rita Fleming**, an obstetrician and Indiana State Representative, gave advice on political advocacy and medicine. We also learned about financial asset protection and had opportunities for mentorship during lunch. Attendees included men, women, students, residents, and attendings from private practice and academics. Survey results from the first and second statewide Women in Anesthesiology conferences in Indiana will be presented by **Dr. Corinna Yu** at the ASA Annual Meeting from October 19th-21st at the Scientific and Educational Exhibits.
